1. General information

The outdoor "Uppsala Friidrottsarena" is located at Råbyvägen 77, Uppsala, Sweden. The arena has 8 lanes. Close by is the indoor arena "IFU" where also the restaurant is located.

2. Final registration

3. Transportation

Transportation to and from Arlanda airport according to separate team schedules. A member of the local organizer will greet you at the arrivals gate.

Since the Arena hotel close to the arena has been fully booked for a long time, all teams are booked at city hotels. Transportation will be carried out by bus between the respective hotel and the arena according to a separate schedule + map (to be included in Appendix 4).

6. Technical meeting

The technical meeting will take place at 20:00 on Friday 25 July in the conference room under the main stands on the outdoor arena. Each country can participate with four people. The final list of championship participants (including late changes) is required by the Team Leaders at the Technical Meeting. The Members of the Jury of appeal will also be confirmed. The

agenda is compiled in Appendix 1.

7. General competition information

Dressing rooms and warm-up areas

At the arena there are limited amount of dressing rooms with showers. On Sunday we ask the athletes to use the dressing rooms for change of clothes directly after their competition to avoid congestion before buses leave for the airport.

Warm up areas are on the throwing field behind the stadium as well as outside the arena (see map in Appendix 3).

Training on Friday: Training at the arena is possible 15:00 – 22:00.

Competition time schedule is shown in Appendix 2.

Poles for pole vault: Please, contact Anders Gustafsson +46 70 2842608 on Friday to leave the poles at the stadium.

Implement check:

Personal throwing equipment must be checked and marked as approved by the Technical Manager before the competition. The equipment must be presented to the Technical Office located at the back of the main spectator building (see map in Appendix 3) not later than 90 minutes before the start of each event. The personal throwing equipment is returned after the events at the same place.

The Technical office is open on Saturday from 11:30 and on Sunday from 08:00.

Call room procedures:

The Call Room will be close to the 300m start in a separate tent. See the arena map (Appendix 3). A Call Room timetable is given in Appendix 5.

• 15 minutes prior to the start of track events



- 30 minutes prior to the start of field events (except pole vault)
- 60 minutes prior to the start of pole vault

It is the responsibility of the Team Leaders to ensure that their athletes show up on time at calling. In the Call Room uniform clothing, cover clothing, shoes and bags will be checked according to the competition rules. No electronic devices will be allowed inside the competition area.

Warm up clothes: In the running events there will be baskets for clothes etc. They will be taken to a place behind the finish line.

Shoes: The athlete is responsible for using shoes that are approved for competition, which means that the shoe model must be included in the latest version of World Athletics' Approved Shoe List and the sole thickness must not exceed 20 mm (except for race walk). Removable inner soles or heel caps are allowed for medical reasons. If an inner sole or heel cap results in the sole being thicker than 20 mm, athletes must present relevant medical information setting out the reasons why customization is necessary.

If athletes are found to be wearing non-compliant shoes, fail to present necessary medical information or do not present themselves to shoe control when requested, they can be disqualified by the referee or shoe control manager.

Introduction of participants

All participants will be lined up and introduced individually before the start of each event.

Leaving the arena: Athletes shall leave the field of play directly after the event is finished through the mixed zone.

100m, 200m, 400m, 110m hurdles, 400m hurdles will be conducted according to WA TR 20.4.3, 20.4.4 and 20.4.5. The B-heat with four runners will be followed by the A-heat with five runners.

800m will be run in one heat.

Long jump, triple jump and throwing events

All athletes will have six attempts. No change in jumping and throwing order after three rounds.

Starting heights and progression in high jump and pole vault

Men High jump: 179-183-187-191-195-198-201-204 +2 Women High jump: 145-150-155-160-164-168-171-174 +2 Men Pole vault: 397-417-437-451-465-479-489-499-506-513 +5 Women Pole vault: 302-322-337-352-362-372-379-386-393-400 +5

Scoring: 11-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1. For relays 11-8-5-2-1.

Protest and appeals: Protests concerning the result or conduct of an event shall be made to the Referee within 30 minutes from the official announcement of the result of that event. The Referee's decision on the protest can be appealed to the Jury of Appeal within 30 minutes. Exception: in the last two events, the protest and appeal time is limited to 10 minutes each. The appeal deposit is SEK 970 or EUR 90.



Medical care: Personnel will be located at the center of the spectator stand on the arena during competition times (see map in Appendix 3).

Antidoping: Doping tests may be conducted. If tests are required for ratification of a national record, Team Officials can order a test via the competition secretary. The cost for additional tests will be invoiced to the National Federation that ordered the test.

Results: Results will be posted on the web as soon as the results are confirmed. (https://www.easyrecord.se/result?guzUyy).

Opening ceremony: There will be an opening ceremony. The Swedish national anthem will be performed followed by a welcome speech for about one minute.

Victory Ceremonies: For each event, 1st, 2nd and 3rd place athletes and relay teams will be called to the victory ceremony as soon as possible after the event. The victory ceremony assembly point is in front of the main stands at the center.

The victory ceremony for the Nordic U20 Match will take place as soon as possible after the last event on Sunday. The National anthem of the winning nations will be played.






