Competition: If only two countries compete, we do match play. With 3 countries, it's all stroke play, which can also be Stableford. Competition format can be altered and whether to use handicaps or not can be decided when the teams have been named from each country.

If three teams participate the competition can follow this setup as an example:

Saturday 18-hole singles for boys and 18-hole singles for girls, either stroke play or Stableford.

Whether to play stroke play or Stableford and scratch or with handicap allowance could be decided based on the level of players taking part in the competition. If the level of players differs very much, it does not make sense to play scratch golf. If there are high handicapped players, we suggest to play Stableford.

On Sunday we suggest to play 18 hole mixed foursome (girl + boy from the same country). If from some country there are not enough players, we could even form mixed pairs from players from different countries. Foursome is suggested, because it is the fastest form of play. In order to get back home on Sunday, the sooner the competition will be finished the better.

If we play stroke play, we follow this point calculation system:

Winners of singles categories will get 1 point, 2nd place earns 2 points, 3rd place 3 points and so forth. If from some country there is not a representative in some category, that country will earn the missing points. For example:

Boys singles' competition:

1st place Sweden → 1 point to Sweden

2nd place Norway → 2 points to Norway

3rd place Sweden → 3 points to Sweden

4th place Finland → 4 points to Finland

5th place Finland → 5 points to Finland

6th place Norway → 6 points to Norway

7th place Sweden → 7 points to Sweden

8th place Sweden → 8 points to Sweden

If no more players → $(9+10+11+12)/4 = 10.5$ points for each missing player's country = 21 points to Norway and 21 points to Finland.

For the foursome competition the points would be given as follows:

Winner earns 1+1 point (this allows points to be divided between two countries in case the pair is from two countries)

2nd place 2+2 points, 3rd place 3+3 points, 4th place 4+4 points, 5th place 5+5 points, 6th place 6+6 points and so on and finally 12th place gives 12+12 points for the country. If there are not 4 pairs from some country, the remaining points would be divided as in singles.

Giving double points in the foursome would keep the excitement high regarding the total competition between countries.

In stroke play competition the total result is the sum of all points given to each country. Winning country is the one with the smallest points sum.

Ties in stroke play and Stableford would be decided based in mathematical result. That is, based on last 9 hole gross/net result (depending whether the competition is scratch or with handicaps), then last 6 holes, then last 3 holes, then last hole and finally by tossing a coin).

In match play winner of each match earns a point, a halved match gives $\frac{1}{2}$ point to both countries. In the end winner is the country with more points.

If one country don't have enough athletes in one class (for example if Norway don't have enough girls in more than one weight class) another country can have more girls. This probably means that more athletes must travel, so the extra expences must be approved of BSC.

The teams can bring up to two reserves to the competition if needed.

Parasport: The teams can bring one athlete and one leader if there is athletes available.

Suggestion for the arranging club:

Competition: Team competition.

The competition will held as classic powerlifting competition. Competition is divided into two groups.

Each group shall have the same number of athletes from each country. If the number of athletes from each country is not equal, the groups shall be divided so that all countries have the same number of athletes in the second group. Lifters are placed in groups depending on nominations, lightest weights being in Group 1.

Results will be decided of each teams results using IPF points. If any lifter don't have a result from one discipline, the results from the other disciplines still count to teams result.

All the 8 team members are lifting in the competition and will receive medals. The 5 best lifters on IPF points are counted in the team competition as long as the team compositions are met (1 subjunior, 2 juniors or younger and 1 of each gender)

Other: Every lifter must have national competition license from national federation which is member nation of International Powerlifting Federation - IPF.

Lifter must have competed within a year.

In competition arrangements will follow International Powerlifting Federations technical rules and organizing checklist.

Competition should have livestreaming on internet.

Anti-doping work: All lifters are in supervision of National Anti-doping Agency, because they have anti-doping agreement with their national Federation. National Federations have own Anti-doping programs which they follow.

Additionally, minimum one lifter from each participating team must be tested at the competition if doping tests are carried out.

Arena: Gym arena, Powerlifting can be arranged in most indoor sports facilities.

Referees: We need 4 referees. Each country has 1 referee each. The arranging club/hosting nation brings 1 ekstra.

Prizes and prizeceremony: Ceremony in the arena. We need 10 sets of medals (GSB).
